Dear all,

I am writing to you to say that the state of the road in Castle Street is probably about the worst in Canterbury particularly when it rains.

Please find attached details that I have submitted to KCC Highways with a plan of layout together with their reply from Mel Dawkings.

I am sorry to bother you, I have been given your name and email address by Tracy Gorham-Brown of KCC.

Recently I sent them a rough plan of suggestions about improvements to Castle Street, Rosemary and Stour Street regarding traffic which attached below.

The reason for the plan and improvements are as follows:

the state of Castle Street road surface when it rains there are great BIG puddles and if you are walking along the narrow pavements you get soaking wet when cars pass by.

The 20 mph restrictions when you come off the Rheims way is not adhered to by all as the signage is not very clear and a 20 mph road marking on the road would help highlight the speed restriction.

3. As Castle Street is blocked off at the junction of Watling street many cars use Stour Street and Rosemary Lane as a

Rat run. I feel that Rosemary Lane and also Marlowe Avenue should become ACCESS ONLY with the bollards outside the Three Tuns removed to access in both directions with restrictions to slow traffic from speeding.

Some time ago there was some talk of resurfacing Castle street and make it like the Kings mile.

I attach a rough road layout (not to plan) of what I feel could be done to help ease the problem A recent news item I saw that LTN's (Low Traffic Neighbourhood) have been introduced in certain areas of towns I thought that if nothing could be arranged for Rosemary Lane and Stour Street etc. perhaps this could be considered.
