Building an additional 1,400 homes on the Whitstable Brooklands Farm development is a grave mistake.

Not only will another precious piece of green land be destroyed, when at a time where global warming is ravaging the planet, we need every scrap of greenery and trees possible, the effects of that amount of houses is horrendous.

SOS Whitstable estimates that that single development alone will add an extra 420 tonnes of water and sewage per DAY into the systems, which are already at breaking point.
