I am writing to say I OBJECT to the proposed development of Brooklands Farm, Whitstable.

I OBJECT to the overdevelopment in the area.

I OBJECT to the increased risk of flooding in the area which is already an issue with surface water on parts of South Street and Chestfield.

I OBJECT to their being insufficient infrastructure to the increased number of proposed houses.

I OBJECT to there being more sewage pumped into the sea as a result of more houses. Our current system is already beyond capacity, discharging more and more into our rivers and sea.

I OBJECT to more people in the area with no additional increase in healthcare available to residents. The NHS is already overstretched and there will be less healthcare available to current residents with no additional hospitals, dentists or GPs.
