I object to the adoption of the Canterbury plan for the following reasons

1. It does not adequately deal with the transport needs of the elderly. The proposals to move car journeys to buses will not work for the elderly.
2. The repair and renewal of existing infrastructure including roads and pavements is not adequately quantified or proposed.
3. With the proposed increase in population plan should included provision for an 24 hour A&E unit as well as a midwifery unit.
- 4 Until such time as the infrastructure of roads, pavements, cycleways, drainage, flood protection, water supply and sewage treatment is guaranteed to be done in line with the proposed population increases then no further housing development should be approved.
5. There is no commitment to provide additional green space amenity to replace that lost already to the rapid expansion of housing development
6. The presentation style of the plan is strong on verbiage and short on easily digested specific policy objectives and targets.
