Overdevelopment of the already crowded area of Whitstable.

Insufficient existing infrastructure leading to congestion on local roads. ( New slip road will add to this.)

Higher demand on already over stretched local medical services and hospitals.

Loss of existing farm and wood land and valuable green spaces . ( The government is asking for the country to grow more food stuff !!.)
