Good afternoon,

I am writing to express my horror and bewilderment at the proposed plans to build a huge new estate on the greenfields and farm land on the sight owned by the University of Kent. This is an area I know well and have walked along, often daily at certain parts of my life, as my children have attended and still do attend Blean Primary School. The Crab and Winkle Way is part of our journey. I do not understand how such a area, which is home to so much wildlife is seen as appropriate to build on. I know that the University is struggling for money and need to sell off the land but to develop it, ripping up generations of history, and destroying homes for animals, birds and plantlife, which is in desperate need of protection just seems incredibly selfish and exploitative.

We have new developments around the area that are on a much more appropriate scale. This proposal does not show any respect for the countryside, the people and creatures that live in it. It appears utterly irresponsible. It will wreck and completely alter the the area and we will never be able to get it back.
