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I object strongly to the proposed housing development on Brookland Farm. While I appreciate the need for housing, there are several significant concerns which should be taken into account before any such development is approved.

Firstly, there is likely to be increased pressure on the drainage system which is already stretched leading to increased sewage problems and overflow of sewage into the sea and rivers especially after heavy rainfall. The ever increasing number of housing developments in this area is already causing increased frequency of flooding and removing a further large natural drainage area with the proposed major housing development on Brookland farm will increase the chance of flooding and overflows due to increased non-absorbable surfaces from new roads, pavements and housing units and will decrease water quality.

Another major concern is the increased traffic in the Whitstable/Tankerton area which has already had increased congestion from other recent housing developments.

With such a large housing development proposed on Brookland farm, this would also significantly impact public services such as Chestfield Medical Centre and Estuary View and Dental Practices which are already at full capacity as well impacting intake at surrounding schools.

In summary, I would very much appreciate reconsideration of the proposed housing development on Brookland Farm. The prevention of sewage issues and avoidance of flooding should be taken very seriously. Alternative options should be put forward that enhance sustainable development and reduce impact on the health of our environment and town.
