I strongly object to Policy W4 Brooklands farm development.

As someone who has lived in this area for many years I'm sick of seeing the destruction of precious farmland for ugly and unsustainable Housing projects.

My reasons are many and valid.

1. Roads around here are already congested and building thousands more on the edge of Whitstable, which already has many new estates, is just madness.
2. Much of that farmland and green land for helps to prevent flooding which, given the challenges of climate change, is another important reason for not building on this kind of land.  
This proposal, which is one of too many local proposals along the Thanet way will put extra pressure on the environment.
3.
