Dear Sir/Madam,

I would like to register my objection to the proposed development at Brooklands Farm in Whitstable on the following counts:

- The loss of "best and most versatile" farm land, which would add to the food security crisis this country is already facing. Farmland that could grow 250,000 tonnes of vegetables a year has already been lost to development since 2010. This is not a rate which is sustainable.
- <u>The area was designated as a 'Biodiversity Opportunity area'</u> in the Canterbury Landscape Character Assessment and Biodiversity Appraisal of 2020. It set out the following aim for the Landscape Character Area incorporating Brooklands Farm, to:
  - Conserve and enhance a well- integrated edge and sharp division between town and countryside. Avoid large scale or tall buildings on this edge which are highly visible and intrusive in rural views.
- I live on and our garden is currently home to herons, wild ducks, hedgehogs, endangered Great Crested newts and a panopoly of wildlife. I can only think that a full biodiversity inspection of the site will find similar examples.
- The infrastructure to support 1,300 new homes does not exist. Southern Water recorded 195 breaches of its storm overflow permits in 2022 affecting food businesses and tourism in whitstable and Tankerton. Swalecliffe sewage works cannot function effectively now, let alone with the extra houses planned.
