Dear Sirs,

I strongly object to the proposed Brooklands Farm Development in Whitstable/Chestfield.

The South East of England has demonstrated over recent years that it cannot sustain water supplies to its existing residents. By approving this development, you will be substantially reducing the ability of rainwater to soak down through the ground to the underground aquifers thereby limiting the available water for the supply, whilst simultaneously increasing the demand for that vital commodity by building 100s of houses - the equation is unsustainable.

Access to medical practices in the area is already in a dire situation - check out the queues at Pharmacies in Whitstable. With the increase in residents that situation will only worsen.

The current Traffic level on the 'old' Thanet Way is already intolerable. Any minor roadworks cause traffic queues of sometimes miles as motorists try to fight their way to work or school. Similarly, the increase due to incoming visitors during the summer months causes those queues to 'gridlock' and that makes it impossible for residents to successfully plan trips. By adding the Brooklands Farm Development, the additional number of vehicles will turn the current summertime problem into an everyday occurrence.
