Good morning Ben .

I am pleased to see a plan is underway to solve the Canterbury Traffic problems.

Unfortunately someone has spent considerable time in an office drawing up a plan which will increase the distance traffic has to travel and therefore further aggravate the situation.

Whereas just fifteen minutes standing at the Westgate Towers looking along St Dunstons would have shown the cause of the problems in that area.

St Dunstons is now so narrow that every time a bus stops the traffic cannot pass so backs up to St Peters Roundabout, (at busy times its back to Wincheap !)

You would also see that the Train Barriers are down far longer than is necessary, so again traffic backs up in both directions. (X2 as the same happens at St Stephens crossing)

Both of the above problems occur numerous times every hour.

Both of these congestion causes are obvious to see and not too difficult to solve.
