Hi, Ben fitter harding

Just had some ideas about your congestion zoning plan, I really like your zoning idea, where the city is broken up into segments.

I think this could be used to display traffic congestion on a road sign message board around the city to show which zones are most congested in real time.

I would change the plan slightly.

Instead of fining and driving in and out of zones, I would suggest just another band around the city that's slightly further outside and would also be a way to move out and around. Also it would make journeys easier and faster when in the outer skirts of the city.

This alongside the zoning map could display the direction to go around the outer band road if nearby zones are congested.

Second the Automatic number plate recognition (ANPR), I think the idea would work better if all the bus lanes in the city where changed to BLUE FAST TRACK lanes which alongside buses can be used by delivery drivers, food delivery drivers, taxis, private hire, motorcyclists. Access is granted to these blue fast track lanes by an annual pass by these eligible categories of drivers. Delivery firms could also purchase these access passes for all of their vehicles if their fleets are travelling through the city. These blue fast track lanes can then be monitored using ANPR cameras and fines can be issued accordingly if no pass is registered on the vehicle.

This would allow these types of categories to benefit from a faster lane. As an example the annual fee could be as low as £12 a year per vehicle.

The biggest congestion in my opinion is the railway tracks. I believe that they make up the majority of the gues because they just block traffic.

My suggestion is to build bridges over both the st dunstan crossing and the sturry crossing.


