- Your message I object to the Canterbury district local plan 2020 to 2045 on the basis that it is environmentally damaging and is driven by the idea that Human needs take exclusive precedence over the living world and does not seek to develop in harmony with the environment and biodiversity. By 2040 Government policy will have eliminated 80% of all existing fossil fuelled vehicles, and when joined up public transport systems are developed offering affordable fares the congestion issue will be manageable and nontoxic. The cost of developing affordable public transport, almost certainly fuelled by hydrogen powered engines, will cost far less, and have less environmental impact than the damage caused by building a ring road around Canterbury. Whilst there is a case to explore alleviating existing "bottle necks" they must be achieved based on causing no ongoing harm to the environment. My view is that the Council should think again and look for 21st century solutions and abandon the old 20th century idea of concreting over the natural world.
