Dear Policy and Strategy Team,

As a Canterbury resident I wish to express my opposition to the proposed Verrill Park development. This site is highly valued for the view of the river and the green space which was a vital thing to so many local people during the Covid-19 lockdowns. In addition, I fear the site is predominantly cannot be integrated adequately and there is a high risk of flooding downhill of this development. The additional traffic involved, particularly to the proposed footpath/cycleway, will destroy the peace that is so valuable in this area. I spend a significant amount of my free time working the land and value this space as an accessible green space which is of benefit to both my physical and mental health. I do not believe that the reality of this project will see sufficient social housing to justify the loss of this green space.

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
