First of all, I would like to thank you so much for listening to the objections raised by local residence to the proposed 2000 houses at Blean. I would like to stress that the same objections would apply to any substantial housing development proposed for the area in the future.

Whereas I accept the necessity for building, I feel there are many unused brown field sites within Canterbury which could be used, together with numerous empty buildings, ripe for conversion into apartments for first time buyers, rental or retirement flats, all of which appear to be needed.

Blean is an area of significant natural beauty and environmental value. Any form of substantial building would cause enormous pressure on already busy roads and services. The practical issues and cost involved in order to demolish the primary school and rebuild it are also complicated and unreasonable. The fact that Tyler Hill and Blean would become part of an urban sprawl would ruin their village identity.

I hope any future plans will be of a more sympathetic and reasonable nature.
