Dear all,

Further to previous extensive objections (which do not appear to have been listened to or reflected in the latest round of local plans), I object to policies N20, N21, W4, and W6 because Whitstable's roads cannot cope with 2,106 more new homes without causing unacceptable impacts on highway safety.

Recent planning applications suggest that the Council have STILL not yet assessed all these problems and considered if adequate solutions are possible.

Also: I object to draft Local Plan policy W4 Brooklands Farm and proposed A299 junction, because the new junction would trigger additional developments alongside the A299 New Thanet Way, causing yet more problems with traffic, water shortages and sewage pollution on our coastline - none of which appear to have been considered adequately. Detailed objections to each of these have been set out in previous submissions.

The plan similarly continues to ignore impact on wildlife, as well as local residents - again, these have been submitted previously but have seemingly been ignored.

The council's continued insistence of pushing through this development, despite numerous substantiated objections - while ignoring numerous other suggestions for sites where developments could be situated on the flimsiest of excuses - means that the only conclusion that can be reached now is that the council is not acting reasonably (in the "Wednesbury" sense) and, should this development proceed, it is likely that numerous submissions for judicial review of the council's decisions will be made. To avoid long and protracted legal processes, I would urge the council to listen to its constituents \*now\* and scrap the proposed Brooklands development.
