It was our understanding that the deadline was the usual midnight.

We have been away, returned home and would wish to object strongly to the proposals to build even more houses in the Whitstable Area. In particular N20, N21, N23, N24. In particular the Brooklands and Bodkin sites.

Reasons include Additional traffic over and above the already congested roads. Increased pollution affecting the health of local residents.

Water/Sewage infrastructure totally inadequate, we still have a hose pipe ban in late October with the existing number of houses. Also a point normally overlooked, without the ability to water gardens through the summer there is an increased risk of damage to building foundations due to shrinkage caused by the drying out of the clay soil.

Conversely the risk of flooding caused by extra buildings can damage existing buildings.

Services such as GPs have deteriorated substantially since the increase in the number of houses built and numbers of people overloading the services.

Change to the environment and green areas around the town would be negatively affected.
