Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to formally object to the proposed housing development in Chartham. While I appreciate the need for new housing, I am deeply concerned that this particular proposal is unsuitable for the area and will have serious negative consequences for both the local community and the environment.

The existing infrastructure is not capable of supporting such an increase in population. Local services—such as schools, healthcare facilities, and public transport—are already under considerable strain. Without significant investment and long-term planning, additional development would put unsustainable pressure on these essential resources.

The local road network is simply not designed to cope with the additional traffic this development would bring. The roads are already incredibly congested during peak hours. Increased traffic would heighten the risk of accidents, worsen air quality, and significantly impact the quality of life for current residents.

For these reasons, I strongly urge the council to reject this application and to prioritise sustainable, well-planned developments that align with the capacity of local infrastructure and the preservation of our natural environment.
