I have already commented on Brookfield Farm - but I would add or reiterate an objection to the height of some of the proposed buildings. How on earth can buildings of up to 4 stories be permitted, when the vast majority of the adjoining houses on South Street are bungalows? This is completely out of scale.

Sites N20 and N21 - I'd like to object on the same grounds as apply to Brookfield Farm, namely:

More traffic - more cars, more congestion, pollution and increased risk of road accidents, particularly as our local roads are no more than lanes in places.

Insufficient infrastructure - we don't have enough water as it is and the proposed reservoir is many years away. More sewage, when it is clear the water company does not really have the required control over it. More flooding, particularly with the increased bouts of very heavy rain that seem to have increased with the acceleration of climate change.

Loss of wildlife and green spaces. I find it very hard to believe that with all the development that is already planned along the Old Thanet Way, that it's necessary to shoehorn more houses into every single available space. And surely the impact of all these sites when built-out should be properly assessed before more land is permitted to be built on.

More people - when we do not have sufficient GP's, Dentists, etc for the current population.
