I am newish resident of woolage village with a young family, [REDACTED]

Moving here appealed with the desire to live in a safer and quieter area for children to grow up.

The proposed development of 17,000 homes in Aylsham on nearby countryside is deeply concerning with other areas in Canterbury far more suitable. 9000 homes was the government target. Its unacceptable this has almost doubled for a proposal.

Erosion of rural communities, resources stretched, noise pollution, air pollution, destruction of ancient woodland, speeding and unnecessary extra traffic through Willage village and Womenswold will damage the future and appeal of these strong rural communities.

I would like to add there is already no enforcement or encouragement to drive slower through forstal road, wollage village and this will create an increased dangerous environment to children and adults.

Security is also a huge concern. The deely sad murder of PCO Julia James from alleged Aylsham resident raises further potential crime and disturbance in the area from Aylsham expanding.

More youth will spend time in the near by wollage village park where there are alot of young children who play quietly and feel safe.

It will also unlikely stop at just this proposal. As a father and husband I strongly suggest other areas are built on and hope the council protect these boundaries of Areas of outstanding natural beauty in kent.
