I realise that the closing date for objections is today but I have been unable to find my way around your 'comments' site and have only recently been made aware of the extent of this life changing proposal to develop yet more houses on this already overdeveloped rural area. There has been a distinct lack of available publicity for this latest development project. Many residents are not aware of the extent and impact this will have on their lives and property.

My husband and I have lived and farmed in Womenswold for well over fifty years and seen the expansion of Aylesham gradually eating up this beautiful oasis of unspoilt Kent countryside. Over many years we have nurtured the land and planted hundreds trees to enhance the landscape and protect it for future generations. Local residents like to use the many ancient footpaths that criss-cross the land and avoid driving on narrow lanes that surround Womenswold and Aylesham.

We most strongly object to the proposed development plan as being destructive to an area of natural beauty which is **already overdeveloped**. Brown field sites are an available option and should be used in preference to unspoilt countryside.

Please reconsider this unwanted and destructive development.
